F3) The chlorine bleach sanitizer in use at the kitchen prep area was measured at a concentration greater than 200 ppm. Sanitizers shall be prepared at an approved concentration. COS by remaking the sanitizer.

A8) Loose pills were observed on the kitchen prep surface. Medicines or toxic agents shall be stored to prevent contamination of food and child contact surfaces. COS by placing the pills in a ziplock bag.

A1) A cloth towel was observed used as a drain surface at the kitchen sink. The premises shall be free of unsanitary conditions. COS by removing the towel.

E9) Medicines were observed stored uncontained in a cabinet above the kitchen prep surface. Medicines and toxic materials shall be stored where contamination of food prep surfaces cannot occur. COS by removing the medicines.

A1) The diapering pad was stored beside the restroom toilet. Premises shall be free of unsanitary conditions. COS by moving the pad.

A1) The facility diapering pad was observed to be torn. Premises shall be free of unsanitary conditions. COS by replacing the pad.

E10) An unlabeled spray bottle was observed stored under the restroom sink. Food and toxic agents not in their original containers shall be properly labeled. COS by labeling the bottle.

F3) The bleach spray located at the diapering station was measured at a concentration greater than 200 ppm. Sanitizers shall be prepared at an approved concentration. COS by remaking the sanitizer.
